The servants went out into the streets and gathered all they found, bad and good alike, and the hall was filled with guests. But when the king came in to meet the guests, he saw a man there not dressed in a wedding garment. The king said to him, 'My friend, how is it that you came in here without a wedding garment?' But he was reduced to silence. Then the king said to his attendants, 'Bind his hands and feet, and cast him into the darkness outside, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth.' Many are invited, but few are chosen."

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM FOR OUR YOUTH

We are beginning our Religious Education Program at St. Anthony's October 14th. Our plans are in the beginning stages because the protocols are always changing. Stude3nts in each grade will meet every other week to keep the population in the building lower than normal. Classes will meet at least twice a month.

There will definitively be an at-home aspect in our program. We will send catechetical books home with your children to provide an opportunity for you, the parents, to work with you children and your youth, in addition to the teachers here. The Church reminds us that parents are the primary catechists of their children. I am sure that you will not only do a great job but that you will find it rewarding and enjoyable. We are still deciding on which resources to use yet for the older grades.

Our in-school program will also include opportunities for prayer, sacraments, music and social activities when possible.

Our first day of Religious Education for Youth will be on Wednesday, October 14th for the following groups:

Elementary Grades: 3rd, 4th & 5th will meet from 4:00pm until 5:15pm. Middle School Grades: 6th & 7th (Confirmation) will meet from 6:30pm until 8:00pm.

Our second day of Religious Education for Youth will be Wednesday, October 21st for the following groups:

Primary Grades: Kindergarten, 1st and 2nd will meet from 4:00pm until 5:15pm. 8th through 12th Grades will from 6:30pm to 8:00 pm.

We plan to alternate each week until Thanksgiving week: November 22nd to 28th.


