9 DAY NOVENA FOR LIFE: January 21 through January 29, 2021

Day One: Thursday January 21st

St. Anthony of Padua Church of Cody, WY

Intercession: May a culture of life grow ever stronger in our communities.

Prayers: Our Father, 3 Hail Marys, Glory Be

Reflection: God created every person in His own image and likeness to be in a loving relationship with Himself. In a world in which the most vulnerable are disregarded, Christ calls us to embrace and uphold the unconditional dignity of every human life. Remember that changing the culture is a process of conversion that begins in our own hearts.

Acts of Reparation: Offer a sacrifice or a fast or a prayer or an act of penance that you feel called to do for today's intention.

Day Two: Friday January 22nd

Intercession: May all people embrace the truth that every life is a good and perfect gift and is worth living.

Prayers: Our Father, 3 Hail Marys, Glory Be

Reflection: At every stage and in every circumstance, we are held in existence by God's love. Illness, disability, or other challenging circumstance never diminishes the value of a human life. God calls us to perfection in love and to embrace the lives we have been given, for as long as they are given, as true gifts. Everyone we encounter on this earth is a gift to help us grow in God's perfect love.

Acts of Reparation: Offer a sacrifice or a fast or a prayer or an act of penance that you feel called to do for today's intention.

Pray: Heavenly Father, thank you for the precious gift of life. Help us to cherish and protect this gift, even in the midst of fear, pain, and suffering. Give us love for all people, especially the most vulnerable, and help us bear witness to the truth that every life is worth living. Grant us the humility to accept help when we are in need, and teach us to be merciful to all. Through our words and actions, may others encounter the outstretched hands of Your mercy. We ask this through Christ, our Lord. Amen.

Day Three: Saturday January 23rd

Intercession: May all who have experienced sexual abuse receive justice, healing, and God's peace.

Prayers: Our Father, 3 Hail Marys, Glory Be

Reflection: Our hearts go out to the victims of the terrible sexual abuses performed by Catholic clergy. It is our prayer and hope that the abused find healing and justice and know that they are never alone. For, "only by confronting our own failure in the face of crimes against those we are charged to protect can the Church resurrect a culture of life where the culture of death has prevailed."

Acts of Reparation: Seek the intercession of Our Lady by praying a Rosary for Healing and Protection. Or offer some other sacrifice, fast, prayer, or act of penance that you feel called to do for today's intention.

Day Four: Sunday January 24, 2021

Intercession: May God's peace fill the hearts of all who travel upon the path of adoption.

Prayers: Our Father, 3 Hail Marys, Glory Be

Reflection: Families hoping to adopt face many challenges along the way. We pray that all who are involved in the adoption process would be filled with the hope of Christ and "the peace of God that surpasses all understanding."

Acts of Reparation: Make an act of faith, hope, or love. Or offer some other sacrifice, prayer, or act of penance that you feel called to do for today's intention.

Day Five: Monday January 25th

Intercession: May each person suffering from the loss of a child through abortion find hope and healing in Christ.

Prayers: Our Father, 3 Hail Marys, Glory Be

Reflection: God's greatest attribute is mercy. It is never too late to seek God's forgiveness in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Acts of Reparation: Pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy. Or offer some other prayer, fast, sacrifice, or act of penance.

Day Six: Tuesday January 26th

Intercession: May all victims and survivors of human trafficking find freedom, refuge, and healing.

Prayers: Our Father, 3 Hail Marys, Glory Be

Reflection: Those who are most vulnerable (migrants, refugees, young people especially runaway and homeless) are most at risk for being lured into situations where they are trafficked. May all who are trapped in situations of slavery be released from their chains of captivity and find freedom, refuge, safety, and healing in Christ and His Church.

Acts of Reparation: Pray for victims and survivors of human trafficking, asking the intercession of St. Josephine Bakhita who was born in Sudan and sold into slavery. Or offer some other sacrifice, prayer, or act of penance for this intention.

Day Seven: Wednesday January 27th

Intercession: May those who long to welcome a child into their family be filled with trust in God's loving plan.

Prayers: Our Father, 3 Hail Marys, Glory Be

Reflection: It can be painfully disappointing when a couple cannot bring a child into the world through their loving union. Even though such times of trial and suffering are shrouded in a sense of mystery, we believe that the Lord loves us. We can trust that "all things work out for those who love God, who are called according to His purpose."

Acts of Reparation: Ask God today for the grace to be extra joyful and share Christ's love with those hoping to conceive or adopt a child. Or offer some other sacrifice, prayer, or act of penance that you feel called to do for today's intention.

Day Eight: Thursday January 28th

Intercession: May those nearing life's end receive medical care that respects their dignity and protects their lives.

Prayers: Our Father, 3 Hail Marys, Glory Be

Reflection: The dying process is a sacred time – a final season to seek closure in this life and prepare for the next. The deadly practice of assisted suicide shortens or even eliminates this sacred season, carelessly cutting short the life of the patient. End-of-life care should instead help eliminate or alleviate a patient's problems, whether they are physical, spiritual, or emotional.

Acts of Reparation: Offer a sacrifice, rosary, or act of penance for a departed friend or one who has no one to pray for them.

Day Nine: Friday January 29, 2021

Intercession: May the tragic practice of abortion come to an end.

Prayers: Our Father, 3 Hail Marys, Glory Be

Reflection: Pray for the protection of all unborn children and to make reparation for abortion, trusting that the Lord hears our prayers. Contemplate how you would respond, in a loving way, to someone considering abortion.

Acts of Reparation: Pray the Angelus or offer some other sacrifice, fast, or act of penance that you feel called to do for today's intention.
