SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT, FEBRUARY 28, 2021

From the Diocese of Cheyenne:

Lent is a 40 day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday. It's a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter. During Lent, we seek the Lord in prayer by reading Sacred Scripture; we serve by giving alms; and we practice self-control through fasting. We are called not only to abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully. We recall the waters of baptism in which we were also baptized into Christ's death, died to sin and evil, and began new life in Christ.

Many know of the tradition of abstaining from meat on Fridays during Lent, but we are also called to practice self-discipline and fast in other ways throughout the season. In addition, the giving of alms is one way to share God's gifts—not only through the distribution of money, but through the sharing of our time and talents. As St. John Chrysostom reminds us: "Not to enable the poor to share in our goods is to steal from them and deprive them of life. The goods we possess are not ours, but theirs" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 2446).

In Lent, the baptized are called to renew their baptismal commitment as others prepare to be baptized through the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, a period of learning and discernment for individuals who have declared their desire to become Catholics.

I will never forget sister's comment! I was in the eighth grade when Sr. Barbara Mary, who hardly knew me, or so I thought, stopped me in the school hallway. She said, "Richard Moser, if you don't continue on the path you have chosen, I pity the world," then she gave me a "look" and walked away. What in the world did "that" mean? I was planning on entering the seminary that coming fall; I guessed that was the "path" she was referring to, but what was this "pity the world" stuff? Now, I am fifty-seven and I finally think that I understand what she was trying to tell me. In her cryptic way she was saying that we all have potential, tremendous potential, for either good or evil. And, evidently she saw something in me that scared her if I didn't keep "it" on the "path, or on the "Way." She was telling me that I had the opportunity to do awe-full things in my life if I followed Christ, or awful things if I chose to follow "my way."

Judas Iscariot was called by Christ to follow Him as an Apostle, yet we remember him as the history's greatest traitor. Hopefully, his last thought was repentance and we will see him in heaven. St. Paul entered history by persecuting the earliest Christians. Jesus appeared to him on "his way" and said, "Enough, Saul, in order to please the Father, you're persecuting the Son." Saul listened and accepted that he was wrong and radically changed his direction. Now he shares his feast day with St. Peter and is a pillar of the Church. Every one of us has an awesome and an awful potential. And, each of us has the free will to choose whichever path to follow.

I spent nine years of my life in jails. Thank God, I was only running them or working in them. Yet, I learned many lessons during those years. I learned that "there, but for the grace of God, was I!" I saw tragic lives, some drastically altered by a single mistake, but most of those lives were "lost" by the paths they chose early in life. The goals of those paths were self-centered and not toward God.

I, too, have made many mistakes in my life, mostly by following "my way," Yet, I have also tried to listen to the Holy Spirit and follow His Way. As a result, the world isn't to be pitied because I'm in it. Yet, I have fallen woefully short of showing the world my awesome potential as well.

Hopefully, you will follow the path to which Jesus is calling you and then, you will be "awesome!"
