Brothers and sisters: Those who are in the flesh cannot please God. But you are not in the flesh; on the contrary, you are in the spirit, if only the Spirit of God dwells in you. Whoever does not have the Spirit of Christ does not belong to him. But if Christ is in you, although the body is dead because of sin, the spirit is alive because of righteousness. If the Spirit of the one who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, the one who raised Christ from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies also, through his Spirit dwelling in you.

Verse Before the Gospel Jn 11:25a, 26

I am the resurrection and the life, says the Lord; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will never die.

Gospel Jn 11:1-45

Now a man was ill, Lazarus from Bethany, the village of Mary and her sister Martha. Mary was the one who had anointed the Lord with perfumed oil and dried his feet with her hair; it was her brother Lazarus who was ill. So the sisters sent word to him saying, "Master, the one you love is ill." When Jesus heard this he said, "This illness is not to end in death, but is for the glory of God, that the Son of God may be glorified through it." Now Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus. So when he heard that he was ill, he remained for two days in the place where he was. Then after this he said to his disciples, "Let us go back to Judea." The disciples said to him, "Rabbi, the Jews were just trying to stone you, and you want to go back there?" Jesus answered, "Are there not twelve hours in a day? If one walks during the day, he does not stumble, because he sees the light of this world. But if one walks at night, he stumbles, because the light is not in him." He said this, and then told them, "Our friend Lazarus is asleep, but I am going to awaken him." So the disciples said to him, "Master, if he is asleep, he will be saved." But Jesus was talking about his death, while they thought that he meant ordinary sleep. So then Jesus said to them clearly, "Lazarus has died. And I am glad for you that I was not there, that you may believe. Let us go to him." So Thomas, called Didymus, said to his fellow disciples, "Let us also go to die with him."

When Jesus arrived, he found that Lazarus had already been in the tomb for four days. Now Bethany was near Jerusalem, only about two miles away. And many of the Jews had come to Martha and Mary to comfort them about their brother. When Martha heard that Jesus was coming, she went to meet him; but Mary sat at home. Martha said to Jesus, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died. But even now I know that whatever you ask of God, God will give you." Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise." Martha said to him, "I know he will rise, in the resurrection on the last day." Jesus told her, "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?" She said to him, "Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world."

When she had said this, she went and called her sister Mary secretly, saying, "The teacher is here and is asking for you." As soon as she heard this, she rose quickly and went to him. For Jesus had not yet come into the village, but was still where Martha had met him. So when the Jews who were with her in the house comforting her saw Mary get up quickly and go out, they followed her, presuming that she was going to the tomb to weep there. When Mary came to where Jesus was and saw him, she fell at his feet and said to him, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died." When Jesus saw her weeping and the Jews who had come with her weeping, he became perturbed and deeply troubled, and said, "Where have you laid him?" They said to him, "Sir, come and see." And Jesus wept. So the Jews said, "See how he loved him." But some of them said, "Could not the one who opened the eyes of the blind man have done something so that this man would not have died?"

So Jesus, perturbed again, came to the tomb. It was a cave, and a stone lay across it. Jesus said, "Take away the stone." Martha, the dead man's sister, said to him, "Lord, by now there will be a stench; he has been dead for four days." Jesus said to her, "Did I not tell you that if you believe you will see the glory of God?" So they took away the stone. And Jesus raised his eyes and said, "Father, I thank you for hearing me. I know that you always hear me; but because of the crowd here I have said this, that they may believe that you sent me." And when he had said this, He cried out in a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out!" The dead man came out, tied hand and foot

with burial bands, and his face was wrapped in a cloth. So Jesus said to them, "Untie him and let him go."

Now many of the Jews who had come to Mary and seen what he had done began to believe in him.

Profession of Faith

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, (At the words that follow, up to and including and became man, all bow.) and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.



DECREE

Since March of 2020, we have been in the midst of a global pandemic caused by Covid-19. Countless people have become ill, and many have died from the virus. The widely accepted medical opinion is that the virus is highly contagious and spread by droplets and aerosols. Face masks, sanitizing hands, distancing from others, and avoiding large gatherings helped to reduce the spread of the virus. Over the last month, the number of new cases and deaths have declined. Even so, the danger for infection remains, especially when people gather in large groups for extended times. Thus, coming together for meetings, prayers, or the liturgy of the Eucharist can result in people being infected and even dying. This is especially true for vulnerable individuals. Although effective vaccines are being administered, it will take several months for the general public to be immunized. Furthermore, variants of the Covid-19 virus may be more contagious and virulent. It may not be safe for some individuals to be at Mass. Also, limitations on the numbers of people who can safely gather could prevent others from participating.

Considering this, I hereby extend to all the faithful in the Diocese of Cheyenne the dispensation from the obligation to celebrate the Eucharist on Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation through Wednesday, June 30, 2021 (see canons 87 §1; 1245). Those who have been fully vaccinated, who are well, who do not have underlying health conditions or are in a high-risk category, and who do not have significant anxiety of becoming ill by participating in Mass, should join their parish in celebrating the Eucharist, while observing the precautions in place.

To those who use this dispensation due to sickness, compromised health issues, or another good moral reason, be assured of our prayers, and know that we need your prayers. I urge you to keep holy the Lord's Day: Participate in a live-streamed Mass, meditate on the Sunday readings, spend time in praying the Rosary or other devotions, meditate on the Lord's suffering, death, and resurrection, and practice the spiritual or corporal works of mercy.

May we see this time as an opportunity to grow in dependence on the Lord and to develop a deeper appreciation of the Eucharist. As we participate in the paschal journey of Christ's death and resurrection, let us pray for one another, especially the sick, those who have died, medical professionals, and those adversely affected by the pandemic. Know of my prayers for you.







Cramming for Finals

Your insides are churning, your stomach's acidic with coffee and your brain is about to explode. It's late, you're tired and you're preparing for a test. Perhaps, just perhaps, you're trying to get all the facts in front of you for one last time; you're merely refreshing your mind; putting it all together. That would be called studying. But, equally possible, you're trying to learn it all at the last minute. That is called cramming.

Surprisingly, when we cram, we may actually pass the



test the following day. However, in reality, we flunked the course. We learned enough of the material to pass the test, but that knowledge was put in short-term memory. It disappears in short order, just as everything in RAM disappears when we turn off our computers.

Why do we tend to do this; we know it's important to study and to learn. After all, that is our "job" as a student. Well, we have other things to do with our time. I could list some, but we all know them. And, it's so much easier to procrastinate about things that aren't fun and exciting.

Many of us tend to do the same thing in our spiritual life. We put learning our faith, practicing our faith and embracing our faith on the back burner during the "best years" of our lives. We don't want to subjugate our selfish pursuits, our materialistic ways and our individualism. But, then, when we face death or old age, we begin to "cram for finals." Surely, we will pass the test because the Mercy of God is absolutely unlimited. But, just as in school, we have truly failed the course. We didn't use our lives for the purposes for which God gave them to us. What great good didn't we do? We missed out on the joy of learning how much God loves us. We missed out on the joy that would have been ours if we had lived our lives unselfishly and cared for others as we cared for ourselves. We failed to leave the legacy of our faith with our children; instead, we potentially leave a legacy of materialism, individualism and relativism that may take a lifetime for them to overcome, if in fact, they know to try.

The sole reason we're here is because God wanted us to be here; he wanted to love us. God loves us everyday, all day, completely. His Son, Jesus, gave everything He had for us. He gave Himself all day, every day, from His birth to His death and beyond. He still gives us His whole being everyday in the Eucharist. He is our God, our creator, our Savior and now He is even our food. He doesn't sit on a throne; He washes our feet, even today. He loves us and protects us from our birth through eternity. He made us to love Him and be grateful to Him every day. He didn't intend for us to do our own "thing" our whole life and then, when the end is in sight, fall on our faces in fear - pleading for His mercy. He will be merciful to us but we have flunked the course of our life by failing to live out its very purpose.

A final thought about this final matter: we don't always get notification on the bulletin board of life that the course is ending. Sometimes, it's early and sometimes it's fast. We can't cram for finals if we have no warning.


