EASTER SUNDAY OF THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD
APRIL 4, 2021

Reading 1 Acts 10:34a, 37-43

Peter proceeded to speak and said: "You know what has happened all over Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John preached, how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power. He went about doing good and healing all those oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses of all that he did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree. Gospel Jn 20:1-9

On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, "They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him." So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb. They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first; he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in. When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had

covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead.

Profession of Faith

He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Sometimes I wonder what heaven will be like. As a child, I imagined sunshine, grassy fields, flowers and children playing. I also imagined everyone eating overflowing ice cream cones (they didn't drip, of course). Why ice cream? When I was very young, a good nun had once explained how everyone in heaven was perfectly happy, yet some were happier than others. She used the analogy of ice cream cones, saying that everyone in heaven had an ice cream cone that could not possibly hold more ice cream, hence, everyone was perfectly happy. At the same time, some people had larger cones because their rewards were greater for living better lives. My life was much simpler then! But, I still wonder what heaven will be like.



I often wonder what it will be like to have no pain, no suffering, to be ecstatic all the time. Yet, I also wonder what it will be like to be caught up in that hurricane of love that is the Trinity, to know and to understand the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. But in the meantime, I'll have to be content to attend the celebration of Mass, to be content when our pastor calls upon and cooperates with the Holy Spirit to bring the Son of God physically into our midst. Then, to be content to participate while Jesus, the High Priest and Victim, is offered to the Father. The Father also being present in the church with all the angels and saints in heaven.

Sometimes, I wonder what it will be like to know how much Jesus truly suffered for me, and to understand how much He loves me for Him to want to suffer that much. In the meantime, I just have to be content to be present every day on Calvary at the foot of the cross during Mass and content to be present at the Last Supper when I receive the most precious Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus into my very own body.

Sometimes, I wonder what heaven will be like when I can be with Jesus. In the meantime, I'll have to be content to be Jesus to others. I wonder what it will be like to see Jesus face to face. In the meantime, I'll have to be content to see Jesus in the face of others. Sometimes I wonder what it will like to see all my family and friends who have died and to see all the other good people in history, In the meantime, I can be content working to help more family and friends to be there.

Sometimes I really wonder what heaven will be like, yet heaven is wherever God is, and He is all around us. He is also physically present in the church and physically present in us when we receive the Eucharist. So, in the meantime I can be content in knowing a little of what heaven is really like. I just can't see it, or feel it, or appreciate it as fully as I will someday.

So, in the meantime, the meantime isn't so bad. And when my life is over. I won't be so afraid because I won't have to wonder anymore; it will just be wonder-full
