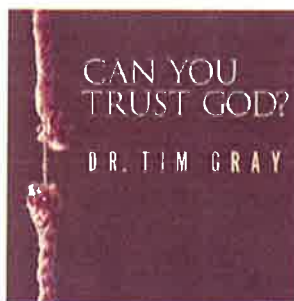

All Roads lead to Rome

In Italy, it is said, "all roads lead to Rome." In Rome itself, however, the saints, the holy places and the all the sacred relics all lead to Our Lord. It was a blessed experience to spend this Holy Week, 2002, in Rome! We attended Holy Mass on Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday with our Holy Father, Pope John Paul II, in St. Peter's Square, accompanied by six hundred thousand pilgrims. At times we were mere feet from "Il Papa." We attended Mass at the altar of St. Peter's tomb. That Liturgy was celebrated by our own pastor, Father Daley. We could see the casket containing St. Peter's remains over Father's shoulder. What a privilege for him and us!



In the Basilica of Saint John Lateran, the Pope's own Cathedral, we saw the location of a piece of the table of the Last Supper. We saw the main altar which encases the altar first used by St. Peter. We walked down streets in the Trastevere area (south of the Vatican), the exact streets where Saints Peter and Paul walked nearly 2000 years ago. We heard from an American seminarian that St. Ignatius of Loyola and St. Francis of Assisi stayed in existing buildings in this same area. It was easy to imagine their presence. The Basilica of St. Cecilia is also there; built over the house where she lived before her martyrdom in the early third century. In 822AD, St. Cecilia's relics were relocated from the Catacombs of St. Calixtus to the Basilica named in her honor.



On Holy Thursday, we attended the Chrism Mass in St. Peter's Basilica with the Holy Father and most of the priests and bishops in Rome. We felt so fortunate to be in the presence of holiness. On Good Friday we walked on soil from Calvary, saw pieces of the True Cross, one of the nails that pierced our Lord's flesh and two thorns from His Good Friday crown. We saw St. Thomas the Apostle's right index finger which may have been placed in Our Lord's glorified wounds. We saw the pillar that held Christ motionless while He was beaten. We crawled up the steps upon which Christ walked up on Good Friday to stand before the crowd screaming for His crucifixion. Later, on Good Friday, we were blessed to kiss the cross containing the wood of the True Cross.

All the Liturgical events were awe-inspiring and when we venerated the sacred relics, we felt privileged to be in their presence. We were favored to view them with our own eyes and touch one with our lips. Yet, on second thought, were we not venerating the instruments of our Precious Lord's execution, the tools of His torture, the ground on which He was crucified, the stairs on which He bled, the cross on which He died? Why were we venerating these objects? Was it because they were instruments of our salvation and we were grateful to THEM? Not at all! We venerate them because they TOUCHED our Precious Lord and because they remind us of all He suffered for us; that's why! In like manner, why do we honor and venerate the sacred places, the proximity of Saints and of the Apostles and the living successor of Peter? Is it because they are greater than Our Lord? No, we venerate them because they lead us to Our Lord. However, we are still filled with awe to see them, to be near them, to be near the relics of the saints, to walk where they walked and to touch what they touched. If this is true, how much more should we be filled with awe and wonder at the Divine Person to whom they point, Our Savior, Himself!



If we could only see Him too! If we could only touch Him as they did, then, we, too, would know the same JOY! All these people, places and things point to Our Savior. All of them are important only because they point to Our Lord.

But we can see Him, too, we can touch Him, too, and receive Him every day ourselves. Are we in awe then, as we are in the presence of a nail and pieces of wood? Or do we take Our Lord for granted? Do we attend Mass as we would attend a lecture on tax tips or are we filled with wonder and awe? It sometimes takes a trip to Rome to remind us of the Greatest Treasure we have right here.



We also went to Assisi for a quick day trip. Being a Secular Franciscan, I was again in awe. We saw the incorrupt body of St. Clare, the tomb of St. Francis, the place of their births and the Baptismal font where both of them were baptized. We visited the Basilica of St. Francis where the walls are covered with paintings depicting the lives of St. Francis and St. Clare. It seems everyone loves St. Francis and every place in Assisi points to him. But, what is so special about this poor, malnourished and outlandish little saint? One thing only, he points to Christ. No saint, before or after St. Francis, has taken on the persona of Christ so completely. Francis was a cut above or a cut outside the norm; he took the Gospel literally. So much so that even in his own followers during Francis' lifetime couldn't follow his example. Some felt Francis was too extreme and unreasonably austere; "For heaven's sake, Francis, they said, we have to have a house to live in!" But until Francis died, they all lived as Jesus did - like the birds of the air.

Francis imitated Christ so well that he was giving the wounds of Christ, the stigmata, yet the world thought he was a fool. Francis is truly a great saint, but he is great simply because he was Christ-like and leads us to Christ. If we are willing to sacrifice and pay for a pilgrimage to Assisi to see Francis' home, are we equally willing to pilgrimage to our own church for Mass to see our Lord? Do we prepare for that journey as well? Do we show up on time and prepare for the day's liturgy as we would prepare for a pilgrimage abroad or Mass in St. Peter's Square?

I sometimes wonder, if we only celebrated Mass once every ten years and only in one location on earth, how much would we prepare for it and anticipate it and participate in it? Truly, it would be an awesome event! However, Our Lord is present for us at all times and in all places. He is so available to us that we sometimes forget that He is our goal. We often get more excited about those people, places and things that lead us to Our Lord, than seeing and receiving Jesus Himself. If we step back a few steps, we can see Him right in front of us and all around us and receive Him into our own bodies. All roads should lead to Jesus!
