LAY MINISTRY- What is it and how does it differ from my everyday witnessing to the love of Christ in my life? In the reading Acts of the Apostles, we see the apostles needing assistance in the daily distribution. They select seven deacons with special talents to help. They could not do it all. So it is, today, with our priests and deacons. They cannot do it all. They need to rely on the laity to help and of course, the laity needs to answer the call to pursue their own vocation to holiness.

We in the laity have so many special gifts that we can bring to help the family. *Gifts that differ according to the grace given to us (Romans 12:6-8)*. Christ's mission was to bring hope and healing to the lowly, salvation to all who would hear, and the life changing love of God to every human person. This is now our mission. We are the body of Christ today. From 1 Peter 2:9, "we are His chosen race, a people He claims for His own to proclaim the glorious works of God the Father". But we must let God work through us; we must give Him permission to work through us. But how? By serving others, we serve HIM.

We have two very fulfilling opportunities for which our parishioners may volunteer: one is bringing the Eucharist to the Homebound and the other is assisting the priest with Masses at the Long Term Care Center & Absaroka Assisted Living. Typically, the Eucharist is brought to the Homebound once a week, at a time acceptable to both parties. It's lovely to visit and share time with those who have very limited time outside of their home.

St. Anthony's offers a Mass to residents at Absaroka on the first Wednesday of the month at 10am. A volunteer might assist staff in bringing the residents to Mass. A Mass is also offered to the residents of Long Term Care Center but on every Tuesday at 10am & one may help in a similar way.

Parish Registration Question: Why is it so important that we register in a parish? Isn't it good enough that we go to Mass?

Answer: Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Many people think that because they attend a particular parish they automatically belong. At times, young adults who have moved away for years think they are still signed up under their parents. But membership requires signing up, formally enrolling yourself in a parish. Registration is a commitment to a community, a way to be included in the religious, social, and ministerial activities of your parish. Your registration affects the parish in many ways. Census numbers can determine how many priests are assigned to a church, what benefits and obligations the community has to the diocese, and how Masses, Confessions, and devotions are planned and scheduled.

Registration shows you belong. It is also necessary for certain benefits, like scheduling sacraments, obtaining sponsor certificates, and getting donation statements for taxes. Most importantly, it lets the parish count on you, to call on you to assist in its mission. Registering in your parish is a statement of faith and confidence in the life and work of your parish. ©LPi

Anointing Of The Sick

Jesus came to heal the whole person, body and soul.

In the **Church's Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick**, through the ministry of the priest, **it is Jesus** who touches the sick to heal them from sin – and **sometimes even from physical ailment**. His cures were signs of the arrival of the Kingdom of God. **The core message of his healing tells us of his plan to conquer sin and death by his dying and rising.**

The Rite of Anointing tells us there is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness is sufficient.

When the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is given, the hoped-for effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be physically healed of illness. But even if there is no physical healing, the primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing by which the sick person receives the Holy Spirit's gift of peace and courage to deal with the difficulties that accompany serious illness or the frailty of old age.

If you are going into the hospital to have a major test, diagnosis, or any surgery please contact one of our priests or the parish office to schedule a time for this special sacrament. You do not have to wait until you or a loved one are on their death bed to receive this sacrament.

EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION

“One cannot know the Lord without this habit of adoring, of adoring in silence. I believe, if

I am not mistaken, this prayer of adoration is the prayer least known by us, it is the one we do the least”, as if it were a “waste of time before the Lord, before the mystery of Jesus Christ”. Instead, we should rediscover “the silence of Adoration: he is the Lord and I adore him”.

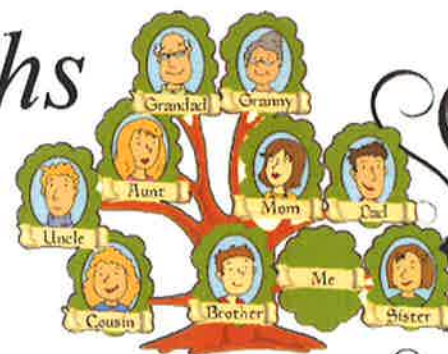
