

## TWENTY SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading GN 2:18-24 Second Reading HEB 2:9-11 Gospel MK 10:2-16

## **HOMILY FOR TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (YEAR b)**

The Pharisees approached Jesus and asked, :Is it lawful for a husband to divorce his wife?" They were testing him. (Mark 10:2)

The Pharisees were not interested in the deepest truth of God. They were only interested in twisting God's truths in an attempt to prove their own self-righteousness. The question they posed to Jesus was a trap, but Jesus doesn't full into it. He asks them what Moses taught about love in marriage and then explains that their understanding of Moses' teaching was based on the hardness of their hearts and not the original intent of God as was revealed in the beginning.


Our church's teaching regarding the indissolubility of marriage flows from the teaching found in the Book of Genesis, subsequently confirmed and clarified by Jesus in today's Gospel. When a true marriage bond is established by the free and total consent of a man and woman, that bond can only be separated by death.

From a much broader perspective, the marriage bond of which Jesus speaks also reveals to us the depth of commitment that God has made to each one of us and the reciprocal commitment He invites us to make. God's Covenant offered to us is freely given, total and irrevocable. This is important to understand. God will never change His mind when it comes to the commitment He has made to each one of us. For our part, we must continuously seek to reciprocate that commitment by giving ourselves to the will of God in the same way.

Just as the Pharisees used the law of marriage to try to trap Jesus in His speech, caring nothing about the deeper truths that this teaching revealed, we can also use the law of God in a way that reveals our own hardness of heart. Love, be it that of marriage, or the love that is the basis of our union with God, can easily be used as a weapon rather than a source of unity. Regarding others, we can easily fall into the trap of using the precepts of love as a source of manipulation and persuasion.

If love is to be pure and holy, it must rise above the erroneous interpretations of love and be live in the way it was intended to be lived. Pure love is always self-giving. It is sacrificial. It always looks to the good of others. Love is total and must be irrevocable. Love forges a bond that should never be broken. It must endure everything and is possible only when it is grounded in the love that God has for us.

MESSAGE: Reflect, today, upon the way that you love. Does the hardness of your heart lead you to misrepresent the love that God wants you to share with others? Is your love total, irrevocable and freely given? Is your love self-seeking or self-giving? Reflect upon the pure and holy nature of the love God has offered to you and recommit yourself to offer this same depth of love to God and to others so that the Covenants that result from your love will always endure.

# Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Gn 2:18-24 | Heb 2:9-11 | Mk 10:2-16

#### GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Everything in God's creation is intended to reflect his goodness and proclaim his glory. It's not hard to understand this idea when we behold the majesty of the sea. It can be more difficult, however, to remember this is also present in each of us and in our relationships - including that relationship God designed for man and woman: marriage. Our ability to turn away from God means that we sometimes reject, rather than reflect, him. This is one reason why Jesus responds to the Pharisees' question by revoking Moses' allowance for divorce, a concession God had made to the Israelites in the Old Testament. Jesus' statement might be unsettling because, in our time, divorce has affected nearly everyone in one way or another. But his words indicate the strength of the covenant the Lord has made with us: his love is permanent and unbreakable. We learn that the unbreakable bond between spouses reflects, in an imperfect way, God's perfectly faithful love for us.

#### GO EVANGELIZE

## PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

We find this truth about love in the wisdom of the Church. Love is not a "feeling." It is an action - a virtue - in which we consistently will the good of another. After all, this is who and what God is: a continuous outpouring of love. Our triune God is a relational community of love, and Jesus offers us the preeminent example of this: As the Son and out of love for the Father, he chose to remain on the cross, regardless of how he felt. Such was his love for us that he willed our redemption and sent us the Spirit to help us remain with him. Marriage, designed by God to mirror this triune communal, covenantal love, likewise requires a decision to love that is firm and constant, despite how we might feel. If we wish to be capable of the fidelity required for marriage, family life, or simply for our relationship with God, we must make the deliberate choice to love - and we must do it over and over. With time and with God's grace, the habit of choosing another's good becomes easier, and we experience the joy of a stable and authentic love.

**PRACTICE** We can reflect God's faithful love by becoming faithful ourselves. Choose one or two ways to exercise fidelity in little things this week. Examples might be getting up at the same time every morning without hitting the "snooze" button; spending five extra minutes in prayer each day; or offering a prayer of thanksgiving to God every time you are tempted to check your phone unnecessarily.


The Hispanic Choir is open to all who enjoy singing for the Hispanic Mass. The Choir will sing once a month.

We invite you to come and experience a beautiful form of prayer inspired by the ecumenical community in Taize, France. Taize Prayer provides a service of quiet meditation and inner peace. It is a call to be still, in the words of Samuel, "Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening." (I Samuel 3:9). It is Christ-centered. It recognizes that every human person is made in the image and likeness of God. Taize reminds us of the living presence of God that we all share in common. Brother Alois (current leader of the Taize community) writes: "What unites us is not a reconciliation project that we planned. It is Someone who unites us: Jesus Christ. He calls us to be together, a sign of his presence and peace." In an age when we are daily made aware of and communicate with people from every part of the world, Taize calls us to come together with all of our differences and quietly seek the real Presence of God within each of us.

The Taize community began in a tiny village in the hills of Burgundy in eastern France. Since 1940 it has been the home of an ecumenical community of brothers whose prayer, three times a day, forms the center of their life. Its founder, Br. Roger Schutz was the son of a Swiss Protestant pastor. Amidst World War II's atrocity, he gathered twelve men from different Christian denominations in an abandoned Catholic church. Although the first Catholic to join the community didn't arrive until 1969, Br. Roger established a personal relationship with popes Pius XII, John XXIII, and John Paul II. Pope St. John XXIII called Taize "that little springtime in the church." Today, the community is made up of over 100 brothers from around 30 nations and different Christian denominations. Small groups of prayer connected with Taize can be found on every continent.

Taize prayer is a call to SILENCE, listening for God's voice. It requires an attitude of humility, for "My thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways" (Isaiah 55:9). We enter a darkened church, lit only by candles centered around the cross (crucifix). Music is soft, taking a single phrase such as "Where there is love, there is God" or "The kingdom of God is justice and peace and joy in the Holy Spirit" and repeating these words until they become part of us. Short periods of silence are spaced between a focusing prayer, scripture reading, and reflection. We take a moment to ask God for exceptional help for our leaders, our poor, those suffering, our families, and our community, then conclude with the prayer Jesus gave us: Our Father. The hour we spend together in quiet reflection allows us to go back into the world refreshed, inspired and hopeful, able to view the world from a different perspective, through the eyes of Christ who prayed at the Last Supper: "I pray for those who will believe in me so that they may all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you, that the world may believe that you sent me." (John 17:20-21)


