HOMILY FOR OCTOBER 13, 2024

The First Reading advises us to use the God-given virtue of prudence in order to seek true wisdom and to distinguish them from vanishing earthly realities, like riches or political and social influence. Solomon chose wisdom before everything else and he received “everything else” along with it. Since Jesus is Wisdom Incarnate, when we put following Jesus ahead of everything else, we, too, receive “everything else” along with Jesus.

The Second Reading warns us that we are accountable to God for our use, or misuse, of His blessings, and that the “living and effective word of God” must be our guide in evaluating our use of His blessings.

In today’s Gospel selection, Mark 10:17-30), we find 3 sections:

1. A narrative about Jesus’ encounter with a rich man
2. Jesus’ saying about wealth as a possible obstacle to discipleship
3. Jesus’ promise of reward for those who share their material possessions with the needy

Reminding the rich man of the commandments that deal with relationships with other people, Jesus challenged him to see what he had, and give the money to the poor. The disciples were shocked by the challenge. But Jesus declared that true religion consisted in one’s sharing one’s blessings with others rather than holding on to oneself in a selfish way or very much attached to them.

Life Messages:

1. We need to accept the invitation to generous sharing.

Initially, Jesus, in generous sacrificial love, gave us His very self; in response, we find rising in our hearts, the desire to give Jesus our own total selves and so to enter the faith relationship which Jesus offers us. God doesn’t ask us to give up our riches, but He does ask us to use them wisely in His service, not allowing them to gain control over our hearts. God gives us time, talents, health, wealth and riches that we may use them as good stewards in the service of others.

2. Let us make a check list of our priorities and attachments and give God top priority.

Are anger, lust, gluttony, evil habits, addictions, jealousy, holding grudges, infidelity or cheating among our habits as priorities? Let us invite God into our lives daily by praying for His strengthening grace and the anointing of His Holy Spirit so that we may give God top priority, keeping the Bible as our guide.

3. We need to gain eternal life by living out our faith in Jesus as our God and Savior, and with God’s strengthening grace, detaching ourselves from unnecessary attachments.

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

All this talk about wisdom in today's readings ... why should we care? Born of a familiarity with the heart of God, wisdom is a virtue that grants us discernment to know right from wrong and to follow God's plan. It is so important to the life of the disciple that it is a gift given to us by the Holy Spirit. In our first reading from – notice – the *Book of Wisdom*, the author, likely expressing the sentiments of King Solomon, praises and esteems wisdom above everything else. Prized over money, health, or beauty, wisdom brings together “all good things.” If wisdom is so valuable, we must follow Solomon's lead and seek it. Where do we find wisdom? In the second reading from Hebrews, we learn that we can seek wisdom in the word of God. God's word penetrates “between soul and spirit” and is “able to discern reflections and thoughts of the heart.” Therefore, immersing ourselves in God's word allows us to discern between right and wrong and choose the path most pleasing to God.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

We become familiar with God's word by reading Scripture and by turning to him in prayer. Prayer, Scripture, and the sacraments are living encounters with Jesus through which we get to know the wisdom of his heart. Still, we are faced with many distractions along the way. What distracts us? Like the rich man in our Gospel, are we distracted by wealth? Or does our desire for health or beauty keep us from the wisdom of God? Although countless temptations in our world can draw us away from pursuing God's wisdom, if we remain close to God, we invite him to help us in our weakness. As Jesus assures his disciples in the Gospel, we can be confident in God's help: “For human beings it is impossible, but not for God. All things are possible for God.” If we seek him and place our trust in him, our lives will begin to reflect his wisdom and communicate it to the world.

ACT Like Solomon, we, too, can pray for wisdom. Read Scripture prayerfully, asking God to help you understand his Word and grant you the gift of wisdom. When you come across Scripture verses that are especially meaningful to you, write them out and put them in prominent places in your home. This will help you keep God's word ever before you.

We invite you to come and experience a beautiful form of prayer inspired by the ecumenical community in Taizé, France. Taizé Prayer provides a service of quiet meditation and inner peace. It is a call to be still, in the words of Samuel, "Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening." (I Samuel 3:9). It is Christ-centered. It recognizes that every human person is made in the image and likeness of God. Taizé reminds us of the living presence of God that we all share in common. Brother Alois (current leader of the Taizé community) writes: "What unites us is not a reconciliation project that we planned. It is Someone who unites us: Jesus Christ. He calls us to be together, a sign of his presence and peace." In an age when we are daily made aware of and communicate with people from every part of the world, Taizé calls us to come together with all of our differences and quietly seek the real Presence of God within each of us.

The Taizé community began in a tiny village in the hills of Burgundy in eastern France. Since 1940 it has been the home of an ecumenical community of brothers whose prayer, three times a day, forms the center of their life. Its founder, Br. Roger Schutz was the son of a Swiss Protestant pastor. Amidst World War II's atrocity, he gathered twelve men from different Christian denominations in an abandoned Catholic church. Although the first Catholic to join the community didn't arrive until 1969, Br. Roger established a personal relationship with popes Pius XII, John XXIII, and John Paul II. Pope St. John XXIII called Taizé "that little springtime in the church." Today, the community is made up of over 100 brothers from around 30 nations and different Christian denominations. Small groups of prayer connected with Taizé can be found on every continent.

Taizé prayer is a call to SILENCE, listening for God's voice. It requires an attitude of humility, for "My thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways" (Isaiah 55:9). We enter a darkened church, lit only by candles centered around the cross (crucifix). Music is soft, taking a single phrase such as "Where there is love, there is God" or "The kingdom of God is justice and peace and joy in the Holy Spirit" and repeating these words until they become part of us. Short periods of silence are spaced between a focusing prayer, scripture reading, and reflection. We take a moment to ask God for exceptional help for our leaders, our poor, those suffering, our families, and our community, then conclude with the prayer Jesus gave us: Our Father. The hour we spend together in quiet reflection allows us to go back into the world refreshed, inspired and hopeful, able to view the world from a different perspective, through the eyes of Christ who prayed at the Last Supper: "I pray for those who will believe in me so that they may all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you, that the world may believe that you sent me." (John 17:20-21)
