First Reading NM 21:4b-9
Second Reading PHIL 2:6-11
Gospel JN 3:13-17

No One Has Ascended Into Heaven

But He Who Descended From Heaven



"It is in Loving the Cross that we find true Peace, not running from it." St. John Marie Vianney

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, a few years ago in a small town, a firefighter rushed into a burning house to rescue a child trapped inside. He came out with his uniform scorched and his body burned, but with the child safe in his arms. Later the town honoured him, not because of fire or pain was beautiful, but because of his sacrifice turned a moment of suffering into an act of love that gave life. Today we celebrate **the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross**, and we remember that at first glance the cross is nothing but pain, shame, and defeat. Yet in Christ it has become the greatest sign of love, victory, and life. Just as that firefighter's wounds spoke of love stronger than fire, so the wounds of Christ on the cross speak of a love stronger than sin and death.

The cross stands at the very center of our Christian faith. Without it there is no resurrection, no forgiveness, and no salvation. When we gaze on the cross, we are not simply looking at a piece of wood, but we are looking at the measure of God's love, a love that suffers, a love that bleeds, a love that saves. In the first reading, we heard how the people of Israel grumbled in the desert and were bitten by serpents, and how those who looked at the bronze serpent raised by Moses were healed. That serpent had no power of its own; it was a sign pointing them back to trust in God. In the same way, Christ tells us that he must be lifted up on the cross, that whoever looks to him with faith may have eternal life.

Saint Paul, in the second reading, reminds us that Jesus, though he was in the form of God, emptied himself, taking the form of a servant, and became obedient unto death, even death on a cross. And because of that humility and obedience, God highly exalted him, so that every knee should bend and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord. The cross, once the cruellest instrument of execution, has become the throne of glory. And in the Gospel, we hear the heart of the message: "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life." The cross is not a curse but the greatest gift. It is the proof that God's love will go to the very end for our salvation.

In our life, each one of us carries a cross of some kind. It may be sickness, family struggles, financial burdens, or loneliness. Sometimes it may feel like the cross is too heavy. But today's feast reminds us that we never carry our crosses

alone. Christ has carried the cross before us, and he carries it with us still. When you make the sign of the cross, do not do it hastily or without thought. Remember that you are signing yourself with the mark of God's victory, God's love, and God's claim over your life.

Let the cross strengthen you in trials, give you courage in weakness, and keep you grounded in faith. Place a crucifix where you can see it every day, and let it remind you that love is stronger than suffering. When difficulties come, do not reject them or curse them, but unite them with the cross of Christ, who can transform even pain into new life. And in a world that tries to run from suffering at all costs, be a witness that the way of the cross is the way of true love, humility, and service.

The firefighter's sacrifice saved one child from death, but the sacrifice of Christ on the cross has saved the whole world. Let us not be ashamed of the cross but exalt it in our lives, hold it high in our homes, and carry it proudly in our hearts. For by the cross, love has conquered, mercy has triumphed, and eternal life has been opened to us. We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you, because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Although God had freed our ancestors in faith from their slavery in Egypt, today we find them grumbling against the Lord as they wander in the desert. Even after we've glimpsed so much of God's goodness, we, too, can begin to grumble in challenging moments of our lives. It's precisely then that we need to cling to faith. After serpents appeared and began to bite those who had grumbled against God, those who had been bitten only had to look at the serpent mounted on a pole and put their faith in God once again to be healed. Similarly, when we find ourselves in the trials of life, we need only look at the cross of Jesus with faith. "Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life." Amid the storms of our lives, we are called to put our trust in his cross, for through it we are saved and set free.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Paul tells us that God the Father "greatly exalted" Jesus for his humility in embracing the cross, and that ultimately, all creation will join the Father in glorifying Christ. We who know the gift of what Jesus did for us on the cross are called to praise him with our voices and our lives. We praise and glorify Christ first through our example. How might our day-to-day interactions give others a glimpse of the humble and self-emptying love of Jesus? Finally, think of the ways that knowing Christ's love has made a difference in your life. Has it made you more patient? Has it made you more hopeful? Think of ways that you could share this in conversation. Telling others about what God has done for you or the difference that he has made in your life is one way of exalting Christ.

PRAISE

Today, spend some time thanking and praising God for the gift of the cross and our salvation in Christ. You might wish to use this traditional prayer frequently used during the stations of the cross in Lent: "We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you. Because, by your holy cross, you have redeemed the world."


